

The Retired Racehorse Project (RRP) is a 501(c)3 charitable organization working to increase demand for off-track Thoroughbreds in the equestrian world. The RRP takes a market-based approach to aftercare, focusing on education, service and inspiration to encourage more equestrians to ride a Thoroughbred.

The RRP is based in Edgewater, MD and the Thoroughbred Makeover takes place at the Kentucky Horse Park.

ORGANIZATION & EVENT NAME

The Retired Racehorse Project (RRP) is based in Edgewater, MD and produces the Thoroughbred Makeover and National Symposium, presented by Thoroughbred Charities of America, which takes place at the Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington, KY.

After the first full mention of the Thoroughbred Makeover and National Symposium, presented by Thoroughbred Charities of America, the event name can be shortened to "the Thoroughbred Makeover" or "the Makeover." The event should not be referred to as "the RRP" — that is the producing organization.

THOROUGHBRED MAKEOVER QUICK FACTS:

- Horses are eligible to compete in the Thoroughbred Makeover once. Eligible horses for the Retiring Racehorse division will have had a race or timed work on or after July 1 two years prior to their competing year
- Mares eligible for the Former Broodmare division will have a Jockey Club reported cover or foal in the past two breeding seasons, as well as a lifetime race or published work
- Horses can begin training for the Thoroughbred Makeover on December 1 of the year prior to their competing year
- Ten disciplines of competition are offered at the Thoroughbred Makeover including Barrel Racing, Competitive Trail, Dressage, Eventing, Field Hunter, Freestyle, Polo, Ranch Work, Show Hunter, and Show Jumper. Horses may compete in one or two disciplines
- Beginning in 2025, a Championship round is offered in the Retiring Racehorse division for the ten highest-placed horses after preliminary competition
- Thanks to the support of presenting sponsor Thoroughbred Charities of America and the generosity of many donors and sponsors, over \$100,000 in prize money is offered
